ENTRY INFORMATION:

1. The daily fee for adults (13-54 years old) is \$5.35. Senior citizens and children (3-12 years old) are \$3.21
1. The membership is non-transferable, and will be revoked if misused.
2. Our daily fee is an admission fee; every individual entering the pool facility must pay the daily entry fee or present their pass.
3. Children under 5 years will not be permitted into the pool unless a responsible adult (18 years or older) accompanies the child in the pool.
4. An adult (18 years or older) must accompany children under the age of 13.
5. Infants and non-swimming young children must be within arms reach of a responsible adult 18 years of age or older at all times.
6. People between the ages of 13 and 18 can visit the pool without an adult, if they have a signed waiver from their parent or legal guardian.
7. The Indian River County, North County Aquatics Center swimming pool is not responsible for any lost, stolen or broken belongings.
8. There are no cash refunds; pool passes will be issued if needed.

WEATHER POLICY:

Inclement weather conditions at the North County Aquatic Center may result in the temporary closing of the pool at Management's discretion. This Policy is in place for the safety and well being of swimmers and the facility. In the event of an electrical storm, patrons will be notified by the Thorgard lightning prediction system. The system will sound one loud air horn for 15 seconds when a storm is approaching. Patrons will be required to leave the facility immediately. The system will sound three, 5 second air horn blasts when the area is clear of the electrical storm and it is safe to resume activities. We will issue pool passes to patrons who have been at the facility less than two hours if the facility is closed for weather conditions prior to 2:30 pm. Patrons must have a receipt to receive a pool pass.

FACILITY RULES:

1. Public use of the facility is permitted only when a lifeguard is on duty.
2. Shower before entering pool.
9. An adult (18 years or older) must accompany children under the age of 13.
Children 5 years old and under MUST be accompanied by an adult over the age of 18 in the water at all times.
3. **Children under the age of 3 must wear swim diapers (No Exceptions).**
There will be no diaper changing on the deck.
4. No running or horseplay on the pool deck.
5. Animals are not permitted on the pool deck.
6. No alcohol, glass, drugs, or tobacco products are permitted in the facility
7. Profanity and other unacceptable behavior will not be tolerated at this facility.
8. No hanging on lane lines or lane markers.
9. Diving is permitted only from the diving boards; **Diving from the side of the pool is not permitted.**
10. Only U.S. Coast Guard approved floatation devices are permitted in the pool.
11. Street clothes, thong suits and bathing suits with metal ornamentation are NOT permitted in any of the pools.
12. People with open sores, and or band-aids will not be permitted in the pool.
13. Swimmers under the 42-inch height requirement to use slides and diving boards.
14. Report all injuries to lifeguard immediately.
15. Obey the lifeguard's directions at all times.

DIVING BOARD RULES

1. One person on the diving board at a time.
2. Diving and jumping are permitted in a forward direction from the end of the board only.
3. Before diving and jumping make sure the area under the board is clear.
4. Do not swim under a diving board.
5. Competitive dives are allowed with the supervision of a dive coach
6. No horseplay on or around the diving boards.

SLIDE RULES

1. Maximum operational load: 1 person, 300lbs (136kg.)
2. Children under 42' inches (1.22m) tall are not permitted on this ride
3. Eyeglasses must be securely affixed to riders with head straps.
4. Swim wear with exposed zippers, buckles, rivets or metal ornamentation are not permitted.
5. Only one rider to enter the flume at a time.
6. Never form chains.
7. Slide must be ridden feet first lying on your back or in a sitting position
7. Riders must wait for the attendants start signal before starting the ride.
8. Do not run, dive, stand, kneel, rotate or stop in the slide.

9. Keep arms and hands inside flume at all times.
10. At the end of the slide, obey all instructions by splash pool attendant and exit quickly.
11. CAUTION: For safety reasons, pregnant women and persons with heart conditions or back trouble should not ride this ride.
12. **Absolutely no life flotation devices on slide**

SPLASH POOL

1. Do not block the end of the slide.
2. Leave the splash pool quickly and orderly.
3. No swimming or flotation devices allowed in the splash pool.
4. No catching children off slide

LAP SWIMMING RULES & ETIQUETTE

Swimming is a great form of aerobic exercise. We encourage you to use the pool as part of your fitness program. There are certain rules of lap swimming etiquette that we would appreciate all lap swimmers to follow. These guidelines will enable you and all other swimmers to enjoy your visits to the North County Aquatic Center.

1. The lap lanes are for those trying to get into shape, or for those trying to stay in shape, and continuous swimming is encouraged.
2. North County Aquatic Staff strongly urges that lap **swimmers share lanes when all lanes are occupied.**
3. When entering an occupied lane, please let the swimmer know before you enter the water.
4. When there are three or more swimmers in a lane, please swim counter clockwise direction.
5. When passing a slower swimmer, please let the person know by tapping their foot. If you find that you are much faster/slower than the others in your lane, please move to another lane.
6. At all times be aware of what is going on in your lane. If a swimmer behind you looks as though he/she may overtake you on the next lap, stop and wait at the wall. Let that swimmer pass first.
7. Please do not stop in the middle of the lane.
8. Please leave enough room at each wall for turns.
9. If you need to stop, squeeze into the left corner of the lane so that other swimmers have ample room for turns. Likewise, at the end of a set, move left so other swimmers can swim in to the wall. Push off under water to avoid making waves for oncoming swimmers.
10. Each lane will accommodate up to five (5) swimmers short course and up to eight (8) swimmers long course.
11. Lap swim schedule is subject to change.

ACTIVITY POOL RULES

1. All children must be accompanied at all times by a parent or a responsible adult 18 years of age or older.
2. **Children under 3 years of age must wear a swim diaper with NO exceptions.**
NO DISPOSABLE DIAPERS ARE PERMITTED
3. No diaper changing at poolside. Changing tables are available in men's, and women's change rooms.
4. Soft toys are permitted in the pool. Other toys can be used with permission of the manager or his/her designee.
5. Strollers and baby carriages are not allowed within 12 feet of the pool edge.
6. Lifeguards are for safety purposes only. They are not babysitters. It is each adult's responsibility to maintain discipline and supervision of the child for whom he/she is responsible. Failure to abide by these rules will result in the Activity Pool privileges being revoked.
7. All children must enter the Activity Pool by walking in at the shallow end.
8. Absolutely **NO JUMPING or DIVING ENTRIES** in the Activity Pool.

POOL CLOSURES

When someone defecates or regurgitates in either pool, HRS regulations state that we must close that pool for certain time periods depending on the amount and consistency and our chemical levels.
